## 1. Introduction

The Drill Advisory Board (DAB) roles and responsibilities are to be read in conjunction with the regulations and by-laws of the Tasmanian Bands League Inc. (TBL)

## 2. Roles:

The roles of the DAB are noted as follows:

- To take the lead role with the administration and running of the TBL State Marching Championships in conjunction with the relevant organising committee
- Appointment of all drill adjudicators for all marching contests administered by the TBL
- Assessment and accreditation of TBL drill adjudicators
- Active promotion of ongoing Drum Major training
- Assisting as mutually agreed with specific training request of TBL member organisations
- Promotion of marching as a recognised activity of TBL member organisations
- Providing advice to the TBL and its NBCA representative on any proposed changes to the NBCA Contest Regulations pertaining to drill and marching

## 3. Responsibilities:

The responsibilities of the DAB include (but are not limited to) the following:

- Provide recommendations for location(s) of the TBL State Marching Championships to the relevant Organising Committee
- Scope and mark out (where applicable) the location(s) of the TBL State
  Marching Championships in conjunction with the Organising Committee
- Nominate appropriately accredited drill adjudicator(s) for the TBL State Marching Championships
- Provide adjudication of participating bands at the TBL State Marching
  Championships in accordance with all relevant contest rules and regulations
- Provide a written report to the TBL Committee at the first meeting following the TBL State Championships
- Seek out suitable potential drill adjudicators from TBL member organisations and/or other relevant persons of interest within Tasmania
- Set and conduct the testing of applicants for accreditation as TBL approved drill adjudicators
- Regularly review NBCA and TBL contest rules and advise accordingly with respect to any relevant changes as they pertain to drill and marching
- Review any proposed changes to the NBCA Contest Regulations pertaining to drill and marching and provide written advice to the TBL and its NBCA representative(s) thereon

- Report annually in writing to the TBL Committee on marching in Tasmania within the preceding 12 months, for inclusion at the Annual General Meeting
- Provide a report at all meetings of the TBL Committee, where applicable on any relevant issues of note with respect to drill and marching
