Major Eric Andersen enlisted in the Australian Regular Army in 1979 and served in bands in Adelaide and Wagga firstly as a clarinettist, but later he changed to the oboe. In late 1979 Eric attended the three year Bandmaster Course at the Royal Military School of Music, Kneller Hall, in London, where he studied conducting, arranging and composition. He became an Associate of the Royal College of Music in 1980.

After being commissioned as Second in Command of the Fifth Military District (5MD) Band in Perth in 1983, he also served as 2IC of 3MD Band in Melbourne in 1986, and in various Instructional and Training Development positions at the Defence Force School of Music from 1986 to 1989. He was then sent back to Perth as Officer Commanding/Music Director of 5MD Band in 1990-91, before being promoted to Major in 1992 and posted as the Officer Commanding/Music Director of the Australian Army Band Sydney. He returned to the Defence Force School of Music in 1993 as Officer Commanding/Chief Instructor, before taking up his present appointment as Officer Commanding/Music Director with the Australian Army Band Melbourne in 1998.

Major Andersen has been active as both instrumentalist and conductor in civilian bands and orchestras, and is currently Music Director of Darebin City Brass (formerly Preston Municipal). He is a regular Adjudicator for the Victorian Bands League, and has adjudicated at Music Festivals and Eisteddfods in Victoria, Western Australia, South Australia, Tasmania, A.C.T. and New South Wales.

Major Eric Andersen lives with his wife, Cheryle, their two children and numerous animals, on their property at Clonbinane, 70km north of Melbourne.

The Tasmanian Bands League are honoured to have Major Andersen as the Conductor of Jubilee Brass "98".

A Little about the Bands whose members make up Jubilee Brass '98'

Latrobe Federal Band: 1 Player

Latrobe Federal Band was established in 1872. We claim to be the oldest continuous serving band in Australia (124yrs). There are older bands but some time either they have broken service or have changed their names.

Hobart City Band: 1 Player

There has been a Hobart City Band since the 1890's. The current band has been active for over 60yrs, firstly as a successful Brass Band and then as a Concert Band. The Hobart City Concert Band has won 9 of the 10 Concert Band Championships conducted by the Tasmanian Bands League.

Ulverstone Municipal Band: 5 Players

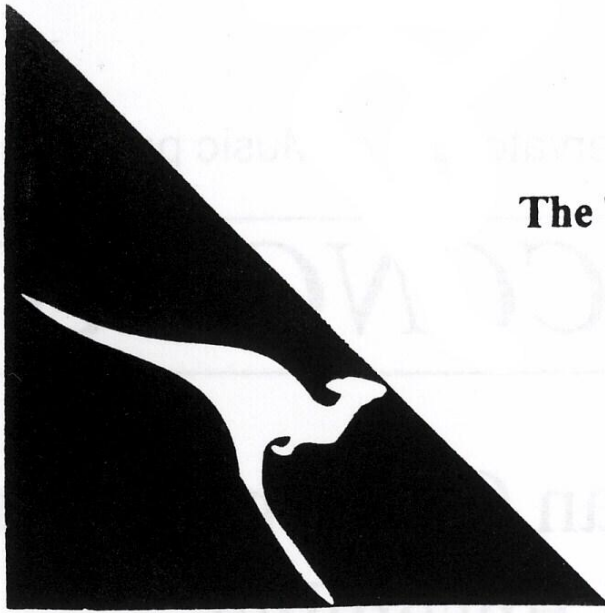
Although records of the Ulverstone Municipal Band prior to 1958 have been lost, there is evidence of Bands existing in Ulverstone as far back as the 1880's. Current records show the Band was reformed in 1958, mainly through the efforts of Fred Hodgkinson. Starting from scratch as an "E" Grade Band it has steadily improved to be one of Australia's most consistent "B" Grade Bands.

Launceston RSL Band: 8 Players

Formed in 1940, the City of Launceston Brass having been originally the Invermay State School Boys Band, then the Invermay Silver Band, Northern Suburbs Silver Band and in 1985 City of Launceston Brass and in 1997 it became the first Band in Australia part of an RSL Sub Branch.

Glenorchy City Concert Brass: 18 Players

Glenorchy City Concert Brass has been in continuous existence since the end of World War 2 under various names, including, the Returned Services Memorial Band, Hobart Concert Brass, and the 7HO Hobart Concert Brass. In 1983 the band was adopted by the City of Glenorchy. It is Tasmania's first "A" Grade Band.
