Graham Lloyd

Major Graham Lloyd M Mus (Melb), ARCM, LTCL, A Mus A

Major Graham Lloyd enlisted into the Australian Regular Army in 1972 as an Apprentice Musician. In 1982, he began his Student Bandmaster Course at the Royal Military School of Music Kneller Hall, Twickenham, London. Among the prizes he received on completion of the course were the coveted Worshipful Company of Musicians Trophy and Silver Medal for the best overall student of the course.

In September 1987, Graham was posted to the now Defence Force School of Music in Macleod, Victoria, and in 1989, accepted the position of Director of Music Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) and Commanding Officer of the then RAAF Central Band. Soon after he was promoted to Squadron Leader.

In February 2004, Graham accepted the position of Officer Commanding/Chief Instructor at the Defence Force School of Music and subsequently transferred back to the Army.

Graham's main interests are conducting, composing, arranging and teaching. He has arranged and composed over 300 works for Concert Bands, Brass Bands and Orchestras – a number of which are published in Australia (including his Brass Band test pieces: *The Loaded Dog;* and *Through a Soldier's Eyes*). He completed his Masters in Music composition at Melbourne University in 1999 studying with Professor Brenton Broadstock.

Graham is regularly called upon to adjudicate State and National community band festivals and contests; and to lecture on various music subjects including arranging, composition and conducting.





Janelle Gough has achieved an incredible amount of notoriety in a short career and leads a very busy musical life including classroom teaching, band and choral conducting at St Virgil's Senior and Junior School, vocal director for the school's musical production 'How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying', accompanying choirs and instrumentalists, trumpeter and vocalists at weddings, art exhibition openings and solo cornet player in Glenorchy City Concert Brass.

Amongst her many awards and achievements are first prize in jazz and popular singing section at City of Hobart Eisteddfod 2004, performing at the gala concert at the National Band Championships in 2004, competing in the Talent Tasmania competition at Wrest Point and solo singing performances at Hadley's Hotel, Duke of Wellington, St Helens Jazz Festival

Janelle currently holds a Bachelor of Teaching 2002, a Bachelor of Music 2000 and an Associate in Music, Australia (A.Mus.A) 1998
