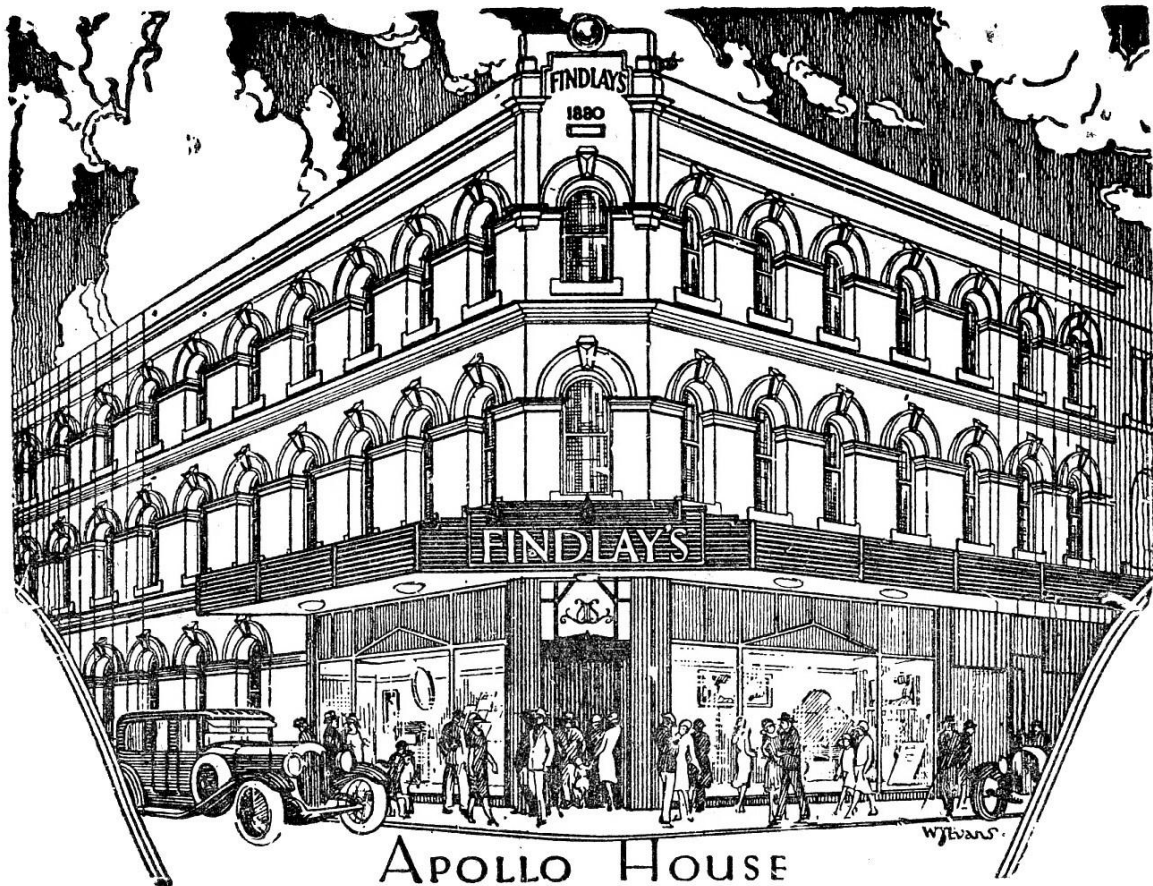


Grand Marching Display

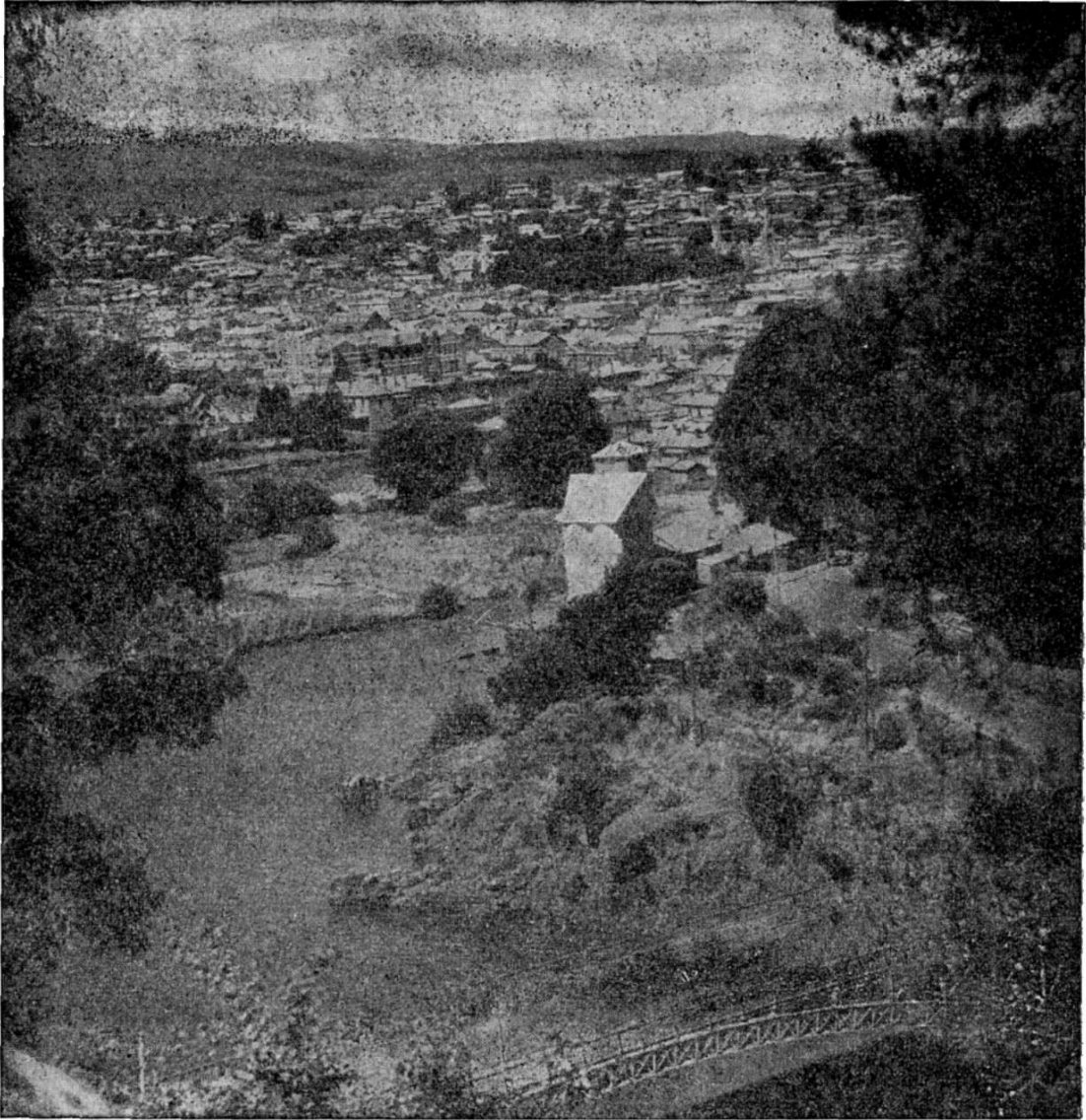

NOTICES AND INSTRUCTIONS

1. This contest is held under the auspices of the Australian Band Council, the Victorian Highland Pipe Band Association and the Tasmanian Bands' League and the rules of these controlling bodies will apply throughout.
2. Bands must compete in all sections for which they have entered on the official programme. Penalty—Forfeiture of entrance fee.
3. Each Band Secretary shall collect the personal signature of competing bandsmen on the form provided. These forms must be completed and returned to the Secretary of the Tasmanian Bands' League before the band competes.
4. Secretaries and Conductors of Bands must observe perfect punctuality in assembling to drawing for place at the times and place appointed and in placing their bands on stand for concert.
5. Each Band, in its numerical order, must be ready to march on before the preceding one has left the stand. Each Band after leaving the stage, must play an item as next Band get ready, if required.
6. All Bands must be properly dressed as Rule 15, Section E, A.B.C. Rule Book.
7. The Contest Committee reserves the right to require the competing Bands to take part in any street marching or playing they may deem desirable.
8. Winners of any event must repeat their item if called upon to do so by the Committee.
9. Each Band will be photographed by the official photographer. The Committee will require one photo of each band for records and additional prints may be had by bands at their own expense.
10. In the Quickstep Competition, the maximum points that may be allotted shall be as follows : Inspection, 20; Pacing, 20; Timing, 20; Evolutions, 60; Music, 80; Total, 200.
11. No Band shall engage in any counter attraction at the contest without the consent of the Committee.
12. All awards will be announced at the final performance on December 27 by the Adjudicators.
Secretary's Office is situated in main grandstand where any information can be had.

 - (2) Bandmasters must bring full score of the following for massed performances :

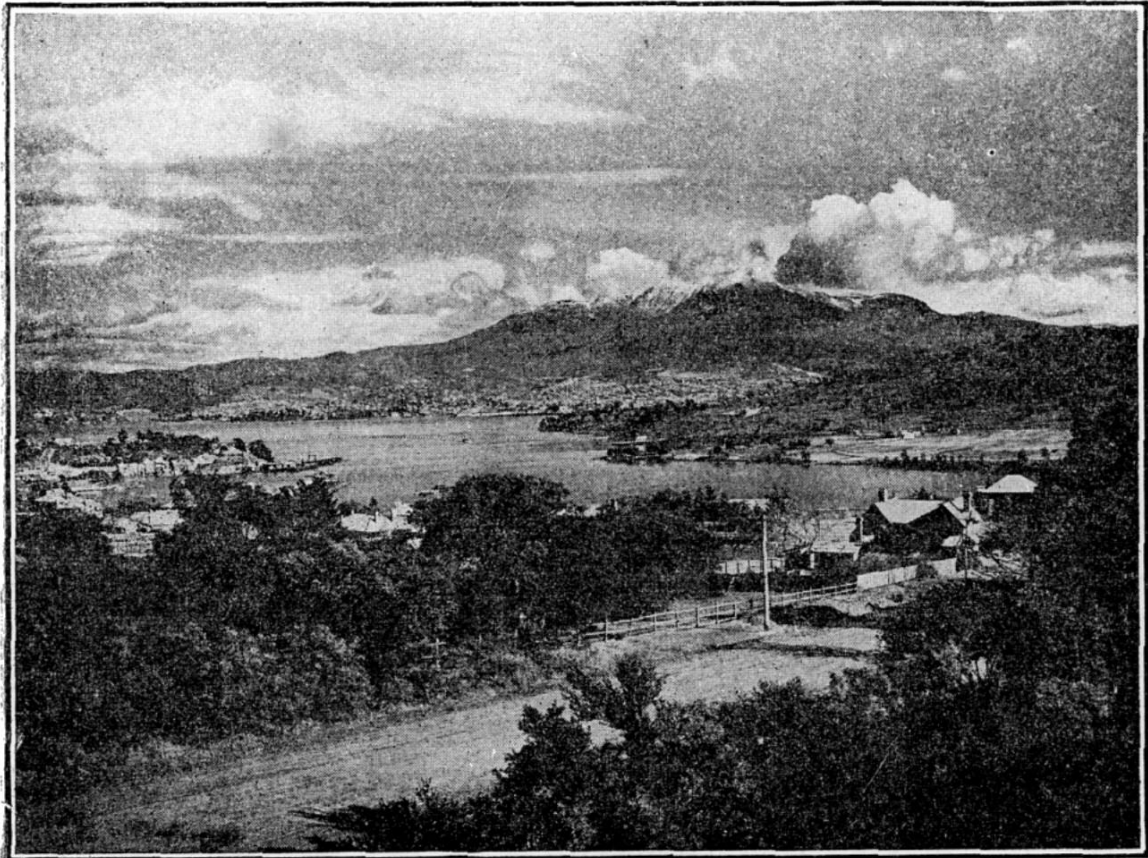
