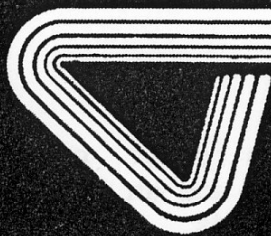
May I on behalf of all congratulate the City of Devonport on their Centenary. The Tasmanian Bands League is pleased to be associated in some small way with the celebrations.

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1990 Tasmanian Bands League Championships

The 1990 State Championship takes on its previous format of Bands performing a Test Piece of music, a Hymn and an Own Choice selection for the Senior Grade Brass Bands. Each Band is required to appear on stage twice, the first time performing their Hymn and the selected Test music, the second, performing an unadjudicated hymn and their Own Choice Selection.

The Junior Bands are not required to play a selected Test piece, but will be performing a Hymn and an Own Choice selection in one appearance on stage.

The Concert Bands are required to perform a Hymn and two contrasting Major Works of their own selection. They will be appearing twice on stage, playing their Hymn and first Major Work on their first appearance, and an unadjudicated hymn and their second Major Work on their next appearance.

We hope that this enables you to enjoy the day more fully, and we thank you for your support.

We wish all Bands the best of luck for the Competition, and hope that only happiness comes as a result of the day

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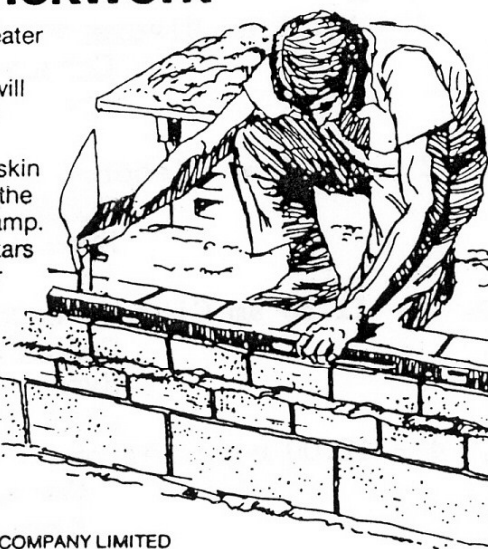
