

Introducing the T.B.L. School Bands Festival Guest Adjudicator for 1997 Mr David Roffe



Mr David Roffe has worked with the NSW Department of School Education for the past 19 years. Originally trained as a Primary School teacher he followed up with post-graduate studies in Expressive and Performing Arts at the University of New South Wales and a post-graduate diploma in Education Studies at the New South Wales Conservatorium of Music. He developed his conducting through The Australian Band and Orchestra Directors Association where he studied conducting under Robert Rosen and Jerry Nowak. Currently, he is the Musical Director of The Georges River Concert Band. David developed the highly successful Connells Point Public School Band Program. This program now boasts over 100 players in two ensembles. The band regularly toured the East Coast of Australia and was used by the Department of Education as a show band for visiting educators and performed at many

official functions. Following his time as a classroom teacher, David worked on the Metropolitan East Instrumental Project where he was involved in setting up bands, while training teachers how to lead their ensembles. He is continually called upon to organise and present in-service courses on the many aspects of organising and running school music programs. These courses have been presented for the New South Wales Department of School Education, private schools, and the Australian Band and Orchestra Directors Association (ABODA). David's other musical experience includes administering the Pan Pacific Music, Dance, Choral, and Jazz Camps for the past twelve years. He is currently Vice-President of the NSW branch of ABODA. David has been principal band conductor for the Metropolitan East Music Festivals and tutor for the Sydney Schools Symphony Orchestra. In recent months, David has been working closely with Studio 19 Sydney in providing musical instrument solutions to schools throughout NSW. CLARENCE HIGH SCHOOL

CLARENCE HIGH SCHOOL BAND PROGRAM is a relatively recent one, but has already given the school quite a high musical profile. The program maintains close ties with the feeder primary schools and with Rosny College, and provides opportunities for students to be involved in Grade 7 Concert Band, Junior Concert Band, Junior Stage Band and Senior Concert and Stage Band. The program was designed from a sound educational base and is constantly reassesed and developed as a learning program. All bands perform regularly in the wider community with Senior Bands undertaking state or even interstate tours at some time in each year.

GEILSTON BAY HIGH SCHOOL BAND

Geilston Bay High School has long had a tradition in bands and performance. Concert bands from the school regularly tour Tasmania and mainland states, the two most recent being Melbourne in December 1996 and Launceston in July 1997.

Students at Geilston Bay High can enter the band program in grade 7 with the Junior Band which is open to all grade 7 and 8 students, progressing to the Senior Band and Stage Band in their later high school years. The band program at Geilston Bay High is held in high esteem by the whole school with the Junior Band rehearsing during school time.

Geilston Bay High is serviced by one full time and two part time music teachers. The present full time music, Mr Nigel Harbod, has ben at the school for six years. Mr Lyall McDermott and Mr Dean Hunt are the itinerant staff. Geilston Bay High school band has been lucky enough to have them working with their band this year.

OGILVIE HIGH SCHOOL


This Group is drawn from our Senior concert band and generally rehearse once a fortnight alternating with the Junior Stage band.

Most of the girls do optional music as a subject and participate in other band and choir groups. This is the first time the girls have participated in a festival of this type.

ROSEBAY HIGH SCHOOL

Rosebay High School Concert Band has 42 members from grade 7 to 10. They rehearse once per week.

The Band is active in providing music for school and community events. Last year the band undertook a tour which included performances in Triabunna, St Helens, Swansea, Launceston and Oatlands.




