#### On-stage Music Adjudicator

#### **Maureen Cameron**



Maureen Cameron began her passion for music with the East Kilbride Borough Silver Band and Clydebank Borough Band. By a young age, she had won the Scottish Championships with the CWS Glasgow Band and competed at the European Championships.

In 1987-90 Maureen attended Salford College, where she studied under Professor David King, Dr Roy Newsome and Elgar Howarth and was one of the last students to work with the legendary Harry Mortimer OBE.

It was during this time that Maureen was invited to play with the world famous Fodens Band under the direction of Howard Snell then later Dr Nicholas Childs and Bramwell Tovey. It was a remarkably successful 11 years with the band winning numerous competitions including the North West Area

Championships, Brass in Concert Championships, French Open Championships, All England Masters Championships and the National Championships of Great Britain.

Whilst recognised as an outstanding cornet player and musician, it is her commitment and passion for the education of young musicians that is inspiring. As the founding Musical Director of the Wrexham Schools Brass Band, Maureen led them on several occasions winning the National Festival of Youth and featuring at the BBC Schools Proms at the Albert Hall, London. In 2003, Maureen was recognised through various awards for outstanding and innovative educational and music programmes.

2004 saw Maureen move to Australia to take up the post as founding Head of Music at St Andrew's Catholic College and Music Director of Cairns Brass Band. Both Partnerships flourished under her guidance with considerable contests and concert successes that have seen her recognised through various awards for outstanding and innovative educational and music programmes.

Maureen is a current conductor for the State Honours Ensemble Programme at Griffiths University. She is very active in the Australian banding scene as a member of National and State competitions, most recently gaining the 2019 'A' Grade, Australian National Championships with Sydney City Brass.

She has adjudicated contests at both State and National level and has been cornet tutor for National Australia Brass Youth Band. In 2018, Maureen was awarded the Cairns Council Woman of the Year (inaugural) Scholarship for her services to music and the community. In 2019 Maureen is delighted to have been named as runner up in the Cairns Business Woman's Club for services to the 'Arts', and her school music programme was named as finalist in Spirit of Catholic Education Awards.

#### Parade of Bands Music Adjudicator

**Dr. Peter Ratnik** 

PhD, M.Mus, AmusA, FAC,RMA

Dr Peter Ratnik was born in East Melbourne and started playing piano at age four, progressing to the clarinet at age eight and then Tuba at 16. After playing in Westgate Concert Band for 12 years Peter found his love for Brass Bands, playing with Preston and the Melbourne Tramways Bands. Peter also performed with the MSO, State Orchestra of Victoria, Australian Pops Orchestra, the AABM and RAA bands.

Peter was awarded a Masters of Music (Composition) from the University of Melbourne and PhD (Composition) from the University of Edinburgh and whilst living in the UK was a finalist in the European Brass Band Young Conductors competition. Dr Ratnik studied conducting with Squadron Leader R.A.Y Mitchell (Director of Music RAAF), John Hopkins and Pierre Boulez.

Dr Ratnik has conducted as a resident, professional and guest conductor bands including: (Australia): Melbourne 150th Youth Symphonic Band, Greater Bendigo Concert Brass, Morwell Citizens, Kyneton Municipal, Frankston City, Geelong Municipal, Corowa, Gippsland Band Group, Hamilton Brass (UK Bands): Whitburn Brass, Tayport Instrumental Band, Stannington, Kingdom Brass, Tullis Russell Mills, Grimethorpe Colliery, Bo'ness, Scottish Co-Op, Bactiguard Wire Brass, Bakewell Silver, Matlock, Dodsworth Colliery, Carlton Main Frickley Colliery, Clackmannan, Bon Accord Silver, Broxburn and Livingston Bands. Military bands include The Band of the King's Division, The Royal Highlands Band.

Dr Ratnik has over 350 compositions and arrangements published in the USA, Europe, UK and Australia by publishers, Ratnik Music Press (Aust, US, UK), Obrasso (Switzerland) and Difem. Many of Dr Ratnik's works are recorded by bands such as Black Dyke, Whitburn Brass Band (Scotland), 13 Etoiles (Switzerland), and military bands Musique Principale de l'Armee de Terre, Musique Principale de Marine and Musique de la Gendarmerie (France).

Dr Ratnik has held numerous positions in educational institutions including CEO Murray Conservatorium, Director of Music S.Anselm's (UK), St Leonards (UK), Balmoral High School and Bainbridge Collage (Victoria). Dr Ratnik has served on the VBL executive and ABODA Victoria Executive and is fiercely passionate about music education and the development of community banding.
